## American Tungsten's Murray Nye to Spotlight "Tungsten in Canada/USA" at CMI Summit IV

Delegates will gain an inside look at permitting milestones, defense sector procurement pathways, and the cost-compression benefits of establishing an integrated tungsten processing corridor within Canada and the United States. "America cannot afford to rely on foreign sources of critical minerals like tungsten," Nye says. "By bringing the pastproducing IMA Mine back online and pursuing additional North American resources, we aim to anchor a secure, tariff-free metals complex that directly serves defense and high-tech manufacturers across the continent."
